# Exhibit Catalog and "Button Sticker" Information Request

- All "Mentors" receive a guarter-page listing in the Exhibit Catalog for a photo and brief bio about themselves.
  - A guarter page is 5-inches wide by  $1\frac{3}{4}$ -inches high.
- To allow time for formatting, proofing and printing, your Exhibit Catalog information must be received by Friday, May 12, 2017 (three weeks prior to the Imagination Fair).
- "Mentors" are asked to submit the following information (as applicable) online at imaginationfair.org/exhibit-create or via email to imagine@hsadventures.org
  - To use the online form, you'll need to register for a website 0 account at HomeschoolRecess (if you don't have one yet). homeschoolrecess.com/register
  - You'll be able to come back and add to or edit your entry up 0 until the Exhibit Catalog goes to the printers.
  - 1. Your name.
  - 2. A brief bio.
    - No longer than 300 characters (which is about 60 words or about 3 sentences).
    - o If you just need to add a couple more words, it's probably okay. If you need to add ten more words, it just won't fit but feel free to ask the Volunteer Event Organizers for help with editing.
    - Please write your bio in the first person. (That is, say "I do this" instead of "Jamie does that" or "S/he does 0 that"")
  - 3. Your title, if applicable.
    - This can be anything that is important to you. Maybe that's your job you're the artistic director of a local theater or an instructor at a martial arts studio or a tutor for a reading program. Maybe that's your hobby - you're a rocketeer or a photographer or a seamstress. Maybe it's your passion - you're a philosopher or a homeschool parent or a field trip organizer. It doesn't matter what you list, as long as it matters to vou!
  - 4. Your organization's name, if applicable.
  - 5. Your organization's contact information, if applicable.
    - Contact information can include website, phone number, email address, mailing and/or physical address.
  - 6. A print-quality digital photo of you!
    - To ensure print quality, please send a larger image file rather than a smaller one.
    - Images will be printed at about 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inches high. 0
    - Wider images will reduce the amount of space available for text.
  - 7. Your phone number, if you haven't sent it previously unlikely we'll use it, but just in case we need to get ahold of you and email isn't working as expected. This won't be included in the Exhibit Catalog or otherwise shared. It's just so we can reach you if email fails.
  - 8. Your mailing address, if you haven't sent it previously so we can send you a thank you card! Again, this won't be included in the Exhibit Catalog or otherwise shared.
  - 9. A photo release this is included in the online form at imaginationfair.org/exhibit-create or use the printed form at the end of this packet.

"If applicable" means that if something above doesn't apply to you, just skip it.

The only thing that is "required" for the Exhibit Catalog is your **name**. Everything else is optional — although a brief bio and a photo are greatly appreciated!





The intent behind including this information is to give the kids a sense of who their "Mentors" are. The hope is that when they look at their Participation Certificates and *Exhibit Catalogs*, both now and years later, they won't wonder, "Who on earth is Nic Rosenau?" Instead, they'll say, "Oh, I remember Nic Rosenau, she was that mom who organized all those field trips."

Entries may be edited for space considerations, as well as for spelling and grammar correction.

Proofs will be sent as soon as all information is received and formatting is complete. Please proofread your entry

# **Mentor Button Stickers**

Exhibitors receive a "button sticker" on their participation certificates from every mentor who talks to them.

The Imagination Fair will provide you with a sheet of 24 "button stickers".

The "standard" Imagination Fair "button sticker" design includes:

- 1. Your name.
- 2. Your title, *if applicable*.
- 3. Your organization's name, if applicable.

- Designs must fits on an  $1\frac{2}{3}$ -inch round label.
- If you use a background color, make the background a bit larger to be sure there's no white edge.
- You may use (just about) any image file format that works for you (bpg, gif, jpg, pdf, png, psd, svg, tif, etc.).

You may also submit just a logo or other image, or if you don't have an image of your own, suggest an image that expresses you or your interests!

The deadline for submitting original "button sticker" designs, logos and design requests is **Friday, May 19, 2017**.

# On the Day of the Fair

#### Mentor Check-In starts at 9:45 AM



The Volunteer Event Organizers recommend that you **plan to arrive at 9:45** AM so that you have time to address any unexpected difficulties and are ready to start talking to Exhibitors at 10 AM.

## **Mentor Folder**



Pick up your Mentor Folder as soon as you arrive at the Imagination Fair.

Folders will be filed *alphabetically by last name* in a file box by the front door and there will also be a Volunteer Event Organizer or two at the door to help you find your folder and to review the contents with you.



Inside the folder, you'll find your Name Badge and lanyard and your "Assigned First Exhibit" number, along with a map of the Exhibit Hall so you can find your first Exhibit space, an *Exhibit Catalog* for you to keep, and an Exhibit Bingo card for your own use.

## **Mentor Lounge**



We have set aside a comfortable area for "Mentors" to wait until the Imagination Fair begins.

"Mentors" will have to cross the Exhibit Hall to get to the Lounge! To ensure that Exhibitors have the Exhibits fully set up for "Mentors" on time and with as little interruption as possible, "Mentors" are asked to resist the urge to engage Exhibitors until 10 AM!

## Quick Tips Talk



There will a very brief "Quick Tips" talk at 9:55 AM to ensure that all "Mentors" have the information they need to succeed!

If you are also the parent of an Exhibitor, you are encouraged to join the other "Mentors" in the Mentor Lounge at 9:55 AM. An announcement will be made in the Exhibit Hall right before it begins.

## Start here! — Your Assigned First Exhibit



Each Mentor will be assigned a starting Exhibit. This is to help prevent clumping and jams by spreading the "Mentors" out evenly around the room at the start of the Imagination Fair.

Your Assigned First Exhibit will be clearly marked on your Mentor Folder and on the Exhibit Hall map inside your Folder. If you can't find your first Exhibit, ask a Volunteer Event Organizers for help — or just choose a likely place to start.

#### **5 Minute Talks**



Most Mentors spend about 5 minutes with each Exhibitor they meet. You do not need to time your talks! Having a general sense of the time you are spending with each Exhibitor is enough. The focus of the Imagination Fair is on the process of creation rather than the products, but you may connect with Exhibitors in any way that feels right for that particular conversation.

Mentors are asked to visit as many exhibits as time allows. Based on past Imagination Fairs, most mentors can expect to visit about 20 exhibits. Mentors are asked to be aware of which Exhibitors are in need of more visits so that no Exhibitor feels ignored.

# Exhibit Bingo



Exhibit Bingo is an original participant idea to help younger kids get involved — but we also use it to help "Mentors" keep track of which Exhibits they've visited! Exhibitors you visit will stamp in the space for their Exhibit number.

You can even show your Bingo card at the Prize table and receive a small prize for every five Exhibits you visit!

## **Missing Exhibitors**



While Exhibitors are asked to stay at their Exhibits so that they are available to talk to "Mentors", sometimes an Exhibitor needs to take a short break. If you arrive at an Exhibit without an Exhibitor, *simply move to the next Exhibit*. You can trust that the next available Mentor will talk to the missing Exhibitor as soon as he or she returns to the Exhibit. You may even find that you circle back around to that Exhibit!

## **Busy Exhibitors**



In the same vein, if you find that the next Exhibitor is already engaged in a conversation with a Mentor, *simply move to the next Exhibit*. You can trust that the next Mentor in line will pick up that Exhibitor when the current Mentor finishes. This keeps the "Mentors" moving and prevents pile ups. Again, you may find that you circle back around to that Exhibit.
